


Alphabet Mini-Books Assembly Instructions

1. Print a collated copy of the alphabet mini-book for each student (Figure A).




2. Fold the cover on the dotted line (Figure B).
3. Stack the other four pages on top of each other and cut on the solid black line. (Figure C).
4. Put the pages in order, and staple them inside the cover.

Try This at Home

1. Finish coloring your Alphabet Mini-Book.
2. Cut out pictures from a magazine that begin with the letter "Qq." Glue the pictures to a piece of paper to make a collage.
3. Glue sand to the letters on page 1. Let it dry. Then practice tracing the letter "Qq" with your finger.
4. Practice writing the letter "Qq" on page 4.
5. Find and circle all the words that begin with the letter "Qq" in this book.
6. Read your Alphabet Mini-Book aloud to an adult.
7. Practice writing the letter "Qq" in shaving cream.
8. Practice writing the letter "Qq" in a tray of salt.
9. Make the letter "Qq" out of playdough.
10. Write the letter "Qq" on a blank piece of paper. Glue quick oats on the letter "Qq."
11. Use water and a paintbrush to "paint" the letter "Qq" outside on the concrete.









Directions: Cut out the pictures on the solid black lines. Glue the two pictures that *begin* with the letter “Qq” in the spots below.




Directions: Use your index finger to trace the letters below. Start on the white dot.

Directions: Trace over the letter “Qq” with your pencil. Say the words aloud. Color the pictures.





Alphabet Recipe



is for Quick Oat Bars

- 1 cup butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups uncooked quick oats
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup crunchy peanut butter

1. Grease 9-inch square baking pan. Melt butter in large saucepan over medium heat. Add brown sugar and vanilla; mix well.

2. Stir in oats. Cook over low heat 2 to 3 minutes or until ingredients are well blended. Press half of mixture into prepared pan. Use back of large spoon to spread mixture evenly.

3. Melt chocolate chips in small heavy saucepan over low heat, stirring occasionally. Stir in peanut butter. Pour chocolate mixture over oat mixture in pan; spread evenly with knife or back of spoon. Crumble remaining oat mixture over chocolate layer; press down gently. Cover and refrigerate 2 to 3 hours or overnight.
